

# How was the Progressive Era a reaction to industrialization?


#### **Problems with industrialization:**


- -unemployment
- -unsafe working conditions
- -child labor
- -political corruption, etc.
- -many argued that gov't had to become more involved
- -reformers wanted social welfare programs
- -muckrakers: journalists who investigated issues of public concern & publicized their findings

#### Muckrakers

- Journalists/news reporters who made
  Americans aware of society's ills
  - Exposed corruption in business & politics
  - Rarely offered solutions



## Legislation passed

## Meat Inspection Act (1906)

-established sanitation regulations for meat packing industry & federal inspection of meat sold across state lines

## Pure Food and Drug Act (1906)

-prohibited the "manufacture, sale, or transportation of adulterated or misbranded or poisonous or deleterious (harmful) foods, drugs, medicines & liquors"

-also forbade misleading advertising
